



AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

Auckland is New Zealand's largest city and the commercial capital of the country. It has a population of around 1.5 million and is located between two beautiful harbours which means you are never far from the sea. Auckland provides visitors with a variety of sightseeing and outdoor adventure activities as well as art galleries, restaurants and theatre and concert venues. The climate is mild with temperatures ranging from 11°C in winter (June-September) to 24°C in summer (December- March) with the wettest months from June to August. Students can easily combine language study with outdoor adventures such as bushwalking, skiing, snowboarding, surfing and bungy-jumping. New Zealand has a relaxed lifestyle and New Zealanders are well known for their friendly, welcoming attitude to visitors.

UNIVERSITY STUDY

AUT International House has academic pathways into AUT University at Diploma, Bachelor Degree, Post Graduate Diploma, Master Degree and PhD level. AUT International Centre provides support in planning for further studies at AUT University.

INDEPENDENT LEARNING CENTRE (ILC)

The ILC is a self-access learning space with a wide range of online and paper-based resources designed to help develop vocabulary, grammar knowledge, listening, reading, speaking and writing skills. It assists students to develop as more effective lifelong learners, bridging the gap between learning in the classroom and life and study in the wider world using English.



FIRST DAY ORIENTATION AND PLACEMENT TEST

All new students receive an Orientation and General English students are given a written test and an oral interview to make sure that they are placed in a class appropriate to their level.

Students should bring the following to school on their first day:

- Passport.
- A recent passport-sized photograph.
- A receipt of their medical insurance and a copy of their insurance policy (in English).

AUT INTERNATIONAL HOUSE GRADUATION CERTIFICATE

Students are awarded an AUT International House Graduation certificate on completion of their courses with satisfactory attendance.

COURSE INFORMATION

- Full time:** 23 hours per week (Core and Elective class and Independent Learning Centre).
- Part time:** 17 hours per week (Core class and Independent Learning Centre).
- Minimum age:** 18.
- Levels:** From Elementary to Advanced. We recommend that beginners take a course up to Elementary level before coming to NZ.
- Starting dates:** Every month with some two-weekly start dates (see our Dates and Fees schedule).
- Course length:** Minimum of 2, 4 or 5 weeks unless otherwise stated in Dates and Fees.

For example: an Intermediate 1 level student will study Core class and Elective class and Independent Learning Centre. For Elective class the student can choose to study General English, Writing, Reading, Speaking, Pronunciation or Business English.

SPECIALISED PROGRAMMES:

These programmes have fixed starting and finishing dates (refer to Dates and Fees). These consist of Class 1 and Class 2 and Independent Learning Centre.

GIE (ACADEMIC PREPARATION & UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE PROGRAMME)

Class 1 and Class 2 and Independent Learning Centre

Entry requirement: IELTS 5.5 with a minimum of 5.5 in Reading & Writing and no less than 5.0 in Speaking & Listening. The GIE programme is a pathway entrance to most AUT University programmes (see website and calendar for exceptions), and an academic preparation course incorporating the development of Academic, IELTS, Research and General English skills.

IELTS LEVEL 1 (IFT 1)

Class 1 and Class 2 and Independent Learning Centre

Entry requirement: IELTS 5.0 with a minimum band score of 4.5

This academic programme develops students' skills for the IELTS exam and includes IELTS examination practice.

IELTS LEVEL 2 (IFT 2)

Class 1 and Class 2 and Independent Learning Centre

Entry requirement: IELTS 5.5 with a minimum Writing band 5.0, other bands minimum 4.5

This academic programme develops students' English language skills for the IELTS exam and study skills for academic study.

CAMBRIDGE ESOL ENGLISH EXAMINATION COURSES

CAMBRIDGE FIRST CERTIFICATE IN ENGLISH (FCE) and CAMBRIDGE CERTIFICATE IN ADVANCED ENGLISH (CAE)

These courses focus on optimum preparation for Cambridge ESOL FCE and CAE examinations and are useful for students who intend to live, work or study in an English language environment. Students take the examinations at the end of the course in Auckland.



CERTIFICATE IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING TO ADULTS (CELTA)

Native speaker level. 12 weeks (Week 1 full time, Weeks 2-12 part time: Tuesday and Thursday evenings 6pm - 9pm) Starting date: refer to Dates and Fees. The CELTA is a pre-service teacher-training course. It is the most well-recognised and respected first qualification in the English language teaching field. Download a CELTA application pack from our website or phone or email to have one sent to you.

DISTANCE DIPLOMA IN LANGUAGE TEACHING TO ADULTS (DELTA)

The Distance DELTA is a unique distance-learning programme for teaching professionals with a minimum of two years experience. For details on course options see www.thedistancedelta.com. AUT IH offers Module 2, the 2-week Orientation course twice yearly in March and September.

TESOL TRAINING COURSE (OPTIONAL TKT)

Level: IELTS 5.5 or Upper Intermediate and higher.
Full time 4 or 5 week course for students interested in teaching English in the future and who want to develop their knowledge of teaching methodology and their language skills and also gain some teaching experience. Students on this course can choose to take the Teaching Knowledge Test (TKT) after the course.

GROUP PROGRAMMES

- AUT International House can provide tailor-made courses for groups.
- We offer closed intensive programmes focused on specific needs or the option of studying fully or partly with other General English classes.
- **Examples of Group Courses:** General English study and activities, English for teachers, English for medical professionals, Business English, Teacher Training, English for Academic Purposes.
- Closed groups may start at any time for a minimum of 2 weeks study. (Minimum enrolment of 10 students is required).

INDIVIDUAL TUITION

AUT International House offers tailor-made tuition for individuals. Individual programmes suit those with limited time or those working in local companies or completing a course of study such as a PhD.

1 Ask AUT International House or your local agent for an enrolment form and for the current Dates and Fees Schedule.

Please read Conditions of Enrolment and sign.

2 Mail or email the completed Enrolment Form to AUT International House or to your local agent with your passport –sized photograph and passport copy.

3 Online enrolment is available - www.autinternationalhouse.info

4 When AUT International House receives your Enrolment Form, we will confirm your enrolment and inform you how to pay.

5 Ask your local agent or your nearest New Zealand Embassy for details about visa requirements. Student visas are required if you are going to study for more than three calendar months.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE:


