

THE VISIT OF THE NEW ZEALAND DELEGATION TO VIETNAM NATIONAL UNIVERSITY, HO CHI MINH CITY.

On April 6<sup>th</sup>, 2015, the New Zealand delegation, headed by Hon Steven Joyce, Minister for Tertiary Education, Skills and Employment; Minister for Economic Development and Minister for Science and Innovation, has visited Vietnam National University, Ho Chi Minh city (VNU-HCMC). The party was welcomed by Associate Professor Duong Anh Duc, Vice President of VNU-HCMC, along with delegation from VNU-HCMC.
