Students receive actual requirements from other domestic and international companies and begin to deploy these requirements into software or services. The total time to complete these task is 6 months.

Students shared us that besides the technical knowledge they had learned, the most important

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skills that they gained from capstone was English skill, communicating skill, negotiating skill, team working, time managing and resolving problems.
